one critical aspect of this planning is soil testing. Here's why soil testing is vital and how to incorporate it into your horticultural preparations:

Soil Testing for Future Planning:

Nutrient Assessment: Soil testing provides valuable insights into the nutrient content of your soil. By knowing which nutrients are deficient or in excess, you can make informed decisions about fertilization and nutrient management for the upcoming season.

pH Evaluation: Soil pH affects nutrient availability to plants. Testing helps determine whether your soil is too acidic or alkaline, allowing you to adjust it as needed to optimize plant growth. Most vegetable crops prefer a pH of 6 - 7 but can usually tolerate 5.5 - 7.

Salinity and Compaction: Soil testing can identify issues related to salinity and compaction, both of which can impact root development and overall crop health. Addressing these problems in advance can improve soil structure. This is increasingly important in high tunnels and soil-based greenhouse systems.

Customized Fertilization: Using soil test results, you can tailor your fertilizer applications to meet your crop's specific nutrient requirements. This not only saves costs but also reduces the risk of overfertilization, which can harm the environment.

Incorporating Soil Testing into Your Planning:

Early Testing: Ideally, conduct soil testing in the fall or early winter to allow ample time for analysis and planning

Sample Collection: Follow proper sampling techniques, ensuring that samples are representative of your entire field. Divide your field into manageable sections and collect samples from each section.

Laboratory Analysis: Send your soil samples to a reputable laboratory for analysis. They will provide you with a detailed report of nutrient levels, pH, and other important factors. Many of the county extension offices still provide this service for free, but if not it is still a good option to contact your county extension agent. Private labs available include Waters Ag Laboratories and A&L Laboratories.

Interpretation: Once you receive your soil test results, seek guidance from agricultural extension services or soil experts to interpret the findings and make appropriate recommendations.

Fertilization Plan: Develop a customized fertilization plan based on the soil test results. This plan should specify the types and quantities of fertilizers needed for each crop you intend to grow.

Crop Rotation: Use soil test information to guide your crop rotation decisions. Certain crops may have different nutrient requirements, so rotating crops strategically can help maintain soil health.

Long-Term Soil Health: Consider incorporating practices like cover cropping, organic matter additions, and reduced tillage to enhance soil health over the long term.

By including soil testing as part of your annual planning process, you can optimize your soil's health, improve crop yields, and practice sustainable agriculture. It's a proactive step toward ensuring the success and resilience of your farm in the coming years.

Bajek V, Munir M, and Rudolph RE. 2023. Soil census of Kentucky high tunnels reveals statewide distribution of two *Meloidogyne* species.

KSU Regional Water Testing Labs

Kentucky State University (KSU) has opened regional water testing labs for growers interested in having their production and post-harvest ag water sources tested. This program is voluntary and can help growers comply with requirements under the Food Safety Modernization Act Produce Safety Rule (FSMA PSR).

Labs are operating in Bowling Green (Warren Co), Hodgenville (LaRue Co), Frankfort (Franklin Co), and Whitesburg (Letcher Co). Testing for *E. coli* in surface and ground water samples is free to Kentucky growers and results are available approximately 1 week after sample submission. The results can be used for your Farm Food Safety Plan, Ag Water Quality Plan, and other certification programs.

USDA's Food Safety Certification for Specialty Crops Program (FSCSC)

Is your farm third-party audited for food safety practices? You may be eligible for expenses in 2023 related to developing a food safety plan, maintaining or updating a food safety plan, certification, fees, testing, and training expenses. The deadline to apply for the Food Safety Certification for Specialty Crops Program (FSCSC) is January 31, 2024.

Are you considering new markets that require GAPs certification? We can help!

Audit Preparation: Bryan Brady with UK's Cultivate Kentucky Program is an excellent technical assistance resource for understanding audit requirements, developing a farm food safety plan, and preparing for an on-farm audit. The success rate for farms working with Bryan is 100%. This program has no fee for KY farms.

Cost-Share Program: The Kentucky Horticulture Council has a cost-share program to help growers recover a portion of the audit fees. Any Kentucky producer completing the third-party GAPs produce audit in 2020 may participate in the KHC Cost Share Program. Cost share will be 75% of the audit cost up to a maximum reimbursement of \$1,250.

Tell me more about GAPs. Good Agricultural Practices (GAPs) is a national voluntary third-party audit program that verifies the audited farm is producing, packaging, handling and storing fruits and vegetables using safe practices to minimize food safety hazards. Several retail and wholesale buyers require producers have third-party audit verification to ensure growers are conforming to the best agricultural practices for food production.







USDA Discrimination Financial Assistance Program (DFAP)

The Discrimination Financial Assistance Program (DFAP) offers \$2.2 billion dollars in financial assistance to eligible farmers, ranchers and landowners who experienced discrimination in USDA lending programs.

The deadline to apply for DFAP is October 31st!

Black Soil KY, in partnership with The Windsor Group LLC, USDA Farm Service Agency and USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service is offering FREE in person workshops across Kentucky.
